SEXUAL HARASSMENT POLICY

It is the policy of WJSD that students have a right to learn in an atmosphere that is free from sexual harassment.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT DEFINED: Unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, sexually motivated physical conduct, or other verbal or physical conduct or communication of a sexual nature when made by a student or employee to another student or employee constitutes sexual harassment when:

1. Submission to that conduct or communication is made a term or condition, either explicitly or implicitly, of obtaining an education, or participating in school-related activities; or
2. Submission or rejection of that conduct or communication by any individual is used as a basis for decisions affecting that individual's employment or education; or
3. That conduct or communication has the purpose or effect of substantially interfering with an individual's employment or education performance, or creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive employment or educational environment.

Harassment of Teachers:

It is against state law for parents or students to verbally or physically harass, intimidate, or abuse a teacher. An occurrence of this nature will result in school discipline and may be subject to criminal investigation.

BUSING

The safe and proper transporting of students is of utmost concern to the district. Student conduct while waiting for a bus or riding on the bus should be the same as in a classroom setting. Behavior that may prevent a driver or students from a safe bus trip may result in loss of transportation privileges.

CONSEQUENCES: All school violations will follow a protocol of warnings, detention, suspension and then possible expulsion. Seriousness of the offense and patterns of behavior will be taken into consideration.

ATTENDANCE - LOSS OF CREDIT (LCA)

It is the belief of West Jefferson High School that students who consistently attend classes develop a strong work ethic for their future and receive higher grades than students who fail to attend. It is the goal of the high school to keep students in school in order to enhance their learning experience.

Students shall lose credit (LCA) for any class in which they exceed 6 (six) absences in a trimester class with the following exceptions:

- Death in immediate family
- School-sponsored activities
- Medical absence-verified by state licensed medical practitioner.
- Excused absences which were made up in designated make-up sessions in accordance with District policy as stated below.

On the 7th absence students will be required to do 2 hours of detention to make up the “seat-time” missed in class. On the 8th absence students will be required to make up 2 hours of seat time, again, and additionally write a letter petitioning the school board for their credit. Absences beyond 8 will be considered a loss of credit unless credit is granted by the Board of Trustees. Seat Time will be required on each absence. Credit loss due to excessive absences will be designated on the student’s transcript with the letters “LCA” – loss of credit due to poor attendance. All appeals will be addressed to the building administrator first then to the School District No. 253 Board of Trustees. In the event that an attendance problem is not otherwise resolved, the student may be referred for expulsion as a habitual truant under the provisions of section 3305 of the Idaho Code. (Note: students who know in advance that they will miss more days than allowable can make-up their “seat time” in advance which will be one (1) hour of “seat time” per class missed. Class time not made up in advance will result in 2 hours of “seat time” per class.)

Make-up Opportunities: Detention sessions will be provided for students who incur more than the allowable number of excused absences and want to avoid loss of credit. These sessions are defined as “extended day time” which allow students to make up the seat time they have missed in a class or classes. Students may make up credit assignments missed due to an excused absence. Make up opportunities will be provided only for students who have exceeded the allowable number of excused absences. Students who know they will be missing school for an extended period of time **must** have their “seat time” time completed before they leave. If seat time is not make up prior to a student missing too many days of school and the student wants to receive credit then the time to make up the days missed in each class is doubled.

TRUANCY

- Step 1 Parents notified/ Detention
Step 2 Parents notified/ Suspension
Step 3 Parents notified/ Suspension or Expulsion.

Students will **not** be granted make up work/assignments that resulted from this absence.

Students may also be subject to additional disciplinary consequences.

It is the goal of West Jefferson High School to keep ALL students safe. All students deserve a safe environment where coming to school is a pleasant experience. Therefore, WJHS has a Zero Tolerance Policy define as: "Violence is any mean word, look, sign, or act that hurts a persons's body, feelings, or things. No one is entitled to use violence. 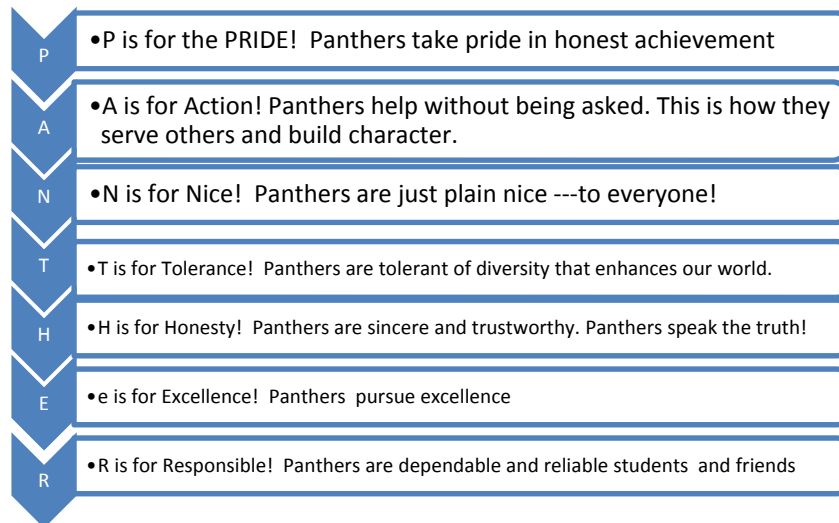

SCHOOL PROTOCOL FOR CHECK-OUT DURING THE SCHOOL DAY:

Schools are responsible for the whereabouts of students during school hours, therefore; Students leaving the school for appointments, illness or parent requests, MUST check out at the office and upon their return students must check back in at the office. Thank You! A parent notification before hand is, also, very helpful. Students who leave without checking out are considered truant.

In an effort to encourage strong character development, the WJHS faculty, student body, parents and administrators embrace the ideals of what it takes to define a **TRUE-BLUE PANTHER**:



PUBLIC CONCERNS POLICY According to WJSD Board Policy # 502.8, the Board recognizes that situations may arise which may be of concern to a parent or the public. Such grievances are best dealt with at the level in which they occurred. Communication is enhanced when parents or students seek solutions through the appropriate chain of command. Any concern involving a teacher should first be addressed between the concerned party and the teacher involved. If the issue is not resolved at this level then the building administrator will mediate a meeting between both parties involved. If matters are then still unsettled then the problems/questions should be referred to the superintendent. If the superintendent cannot settle the matter satisfactorily, it may be brought before the Board of Trustees.

FREEDOM OF SPEECH AND ASSEMBLY

WJHS students are entitled to participate in the democratic process of free speech and assembly. Verbal opinions shall not interfere with the freedom of others to express themselves. The use of obscenities, inflammatory statements or personal attacks will not be tolerated. Students must assemble peaceably and must go through appropriate channels and school protocol. Demonstrations which interfere with operation or education of the school are inappropriate and prohibited.

Dress Code:

The Board of Trustees of West Jefferson School District #253 recognizes the individual right of students to choose their style of dress. The Board also recognizes that the majority of this District's students have elected to wear appropriate clothing and observe good grooming habits. Since it is the duty of the Board to provide a safe environment and an educational atmosphere conducive to learning, clothing should always be clean, mended, and suitable to body size and in good taste. Clothing and grooming habits that are disruptive or have a detrimental effect on the educational process are prohibited. In order to create workable and enforceable standards for student dress, the following are considered to have a **detrimental effect** on the educational process and would be **unacceptable**. This code applies to all school affiliated activities.

- No references to drugs, alcohol or tobacco products
- No references that promote gangs, violence or anti-social behavior either by color, design, insignia or writing.
- No references that degrade gender, religion, culture or ethnic values
- No tank tops, bare midriff-type shirts, muscle shirts or half tops for either males or females.
- No displaying of undergarments, no low-riders that expose boxers or undergarments.
- No short skirt or short hemlines above 3 inches from the knees.
- No accessories that could inflict bodily harm

- No hats in assemblies
- No sunglasses in the building anywhere, anytime
- No see-through or revealing clothing
- No sagging pants, blue jeans, shorts or hats are allowed at formal and semi-formal dances
- **TECHNOLOGY:**

Students must abide by the terms and conditions of the WJHS technology agreement contract. Each student is required to sign a technology agreement which gives him or her the privilege of using the technology available at WJHS. This agreement is signed when a student enters WJHS and is valid for the entire time the student attends WJHS.

CLASS ADVISORS:

Each class has assigned advisors. These advisors **MUST** be kept informed of planned student activities. A class advisor must approve all class activities and expenditures. Advisors are to be used as chaperones and to ensure successful class activities.

STUDENT CONDUCT:

Our mission is to provide a quality education for all students and assist each in developing the skills and values necessary for success and fulfillment in an ever changing world.

CITIZENSHIP:

Students are expected to exhibit good citizenship at all times and places in the school and its activities. Students who have received a consequence from teachers, staff or administration for truancies, upon the 4th tardy, or other disruptive actions will be required to serve their detention within two weeks. Students will be given a designated date for completion and reminders may be put on their lockers. If the detention is not made up within the two week grace period then the student will be ineligible for extra-curricular activities and will be given 1 day of school suspension. Consequences for minor discipline infractions include but are not limited to:

- Teacher, staff member, or administrator issuing the consequence
- Service project duties as assigned by the teacher, staff member or administrator
- Most commonly, students will serve a designated detention time. Minimum of 2 hours unless otherwise specified.
- At WJHS we expect students to be respectful to each other and towards their teachers, should disrespectful actions persist a student may be suspended for up to 1 – 5 days.

WEST JEFFERSON ATTENDANCE POLICY

ATTENDANCE PROCEDURE

When a student in grade 9 through 12 is absent from a class period more than 6 (six) days per trimester, they will not receive credit for that class.

1. Parents are **expected** to call the office the day of the absence or within 24 hours to verify the absence.
2. Attendance is the responsibility of the parents & students.
3. Students are responsible for serving detention on the 7th (seventh) absence, upon the 8th (eighth) absence the student will have to petition the school board for their credit and serve 2 hours of detention time. Each successive absence will require detention as designated by the high school administrator.
4. Students must bring a written note on the day following her/his absence. The note will be kept in the students file.
5. Each note must be signed and dated by the parent.
6. If the student is leaving the school they **must check out at the office with a note or phone call from parent.**
7. Unexcused absence is when a student leaves the school building without prior approval by the parent or guardian (given by phone or written note) and without checking out through the office. It will be considered truant, when the student intentionally skips classes without the consent/knowledge of the parent.

TARDINESS

Punctuality is a life skill. **When a student is tardy, serious disruption to effective learning occurs.** Teachers will discuss classroom tardy policies with the students. **School policy states that students are considered absent if they are more than 15 minutes tardy.** However, since instructional time is important, students are encouraged to attend class regardless of their arrival time.

Teachers may complete a formal disciplinary referral when a student has reached their 4th tardy in a class. The normal referral process will be followed and the student will receive detention.

ATHLETIC PROGRAM

We encourage students to participate in athletic programs. Any student participating in this program is required to meet the Idaho High School Activities Association Eligibility Requirements. In addition, all athletes must have the necessary forms and questionnaires completed, pay participation fees, purchase an activity card, and have a current physical on file.

IHSAA Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible to participate, students must have earned 4 credits from the previous trimester (4 of 5 classes), passed all core classes and have a 2.0 average GPA. Students must also be enrolled as full-time students during the sports season to be eligible to participate. Please note that Release Time, Seminary and Off-Campus do not count as classes for eligibility purposes. Contact the Athletic Director for more information.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

CD Players, I-Pods, cell phones and other electronic devices *shall not be used* at WJHS without *explicit* permission of each teacher. Each teacher is entitled to his or her specific electronic device policy. Parents are encouraged to leave messages at the office rather than trying to contact their student during the school day.

Consequences of violation of electronic device policy

- Step One: Student will have device confiscated. Device may be picked up at end of school day.
- Step Two: Student will again have device confiscated and parent will have to pick up device from the administration.
- Step Three: Student will have device confiscated and student will serve detention time for insubordination. Parent will need to pick up device from administration and student will not be allowed to have said device at school for the rest of the year.

502.1 WJHS Teacher Classroom Authority

The Idaho code establishes the teacher's right to control students as follows: "Powers and Duties of Teachers: In absences of any statute or rule or regulation of the Board, any teacher employed by the district shall have the right to direct how and when each pupil shall demean himself while in attendance at the school. It is the duty of a teacher to carry out the rules and regulations of the Board in controlling and maintaining discipline, and a teacher shall have the power to adopt any reasonable rule or regulation to control and maintain discipline in and otherwise govern the classroom, not inconsistent with any statute or rule or regulation of the Board."

502.14 DANGEROUS WEAPONS

Zero Tolerance for weapons. Board policy 502.14 forbids students to bring weapons to school or school sponsored activities either on the person, in a purse, handbag, backpack, locker or vehicle. The school shall immediately suspend the student(s) from school and the violation will be reported to police authorities. A Due Process hearing will be provided within five school days of the incident. Any student expelled under this section may not apply for re-admission for one year from the date of expulsion. If re-admission is granted, it will not occur until the start of the next grading session.

SEARCH & SEIZURE: including locker policy

In order to maintain an orderly and safe educational atmosphere and to ensure good discipline is followed in a public school setting, all school property including, but not limited to, lockers, busses, buildings, grounds and other physical items including school equipment of WJSD #253 is under the direct jurisdiction of the school district. Students need to be advised that under jurisdiction of state law that WJHS staff, administration and security officers can check/search any locker, book bag, purse or vehicle when probable cause is present. School authorities may conduct periodic inspections of lockers at any time, without notice, without student consent and without a search warrant. Lockers are to be treated with care. Damage to a locker will result in locker repair fees.

CHANGING CLASSES

Because classes are assigned and materials purchased based on student interest in a course, once schedules have been made students may not change a class after the first two days of school. A late registration fee of \$10.00 will be assessed if a student changes a class within the first two days of school. Exception may be made for students

The deadline to check out of a class and not receive a failing grade in the class is **ten school days from the first day of class**. Students checking out after the deadline time will receive a letter grade of F in the class. A student will not be allowed to check into a new class after the 10th day.

CORRESPONDENCE CREDITS

Students receiving a WJHS diploma are expected to reach a high standard of performance. Therefore, students needing credit recovery will need to first schedule a make up credit through the District approved PLATO program or through an accredited high school program. No Central High School packets will be allowed unless the student has first, failed the course here and second is unable to schedule in enough PLATO credit recovery courses at WJHS.
